

In 1849, this newspaper headline was an historic call to action! More than 200,000 men, inflamed with gold fever, made the long and perilous journey to California Territory.

BBQ INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Open the grill cover.
- 2. Turn on the timer which is the black knob located on the back post. You will see a 1, 2, or 3, those are the hours. So, if you turn it to one the gas will stay on for 1 hour and then turn itself off.
- 3. There are (2) burners - light them one at a time by turning the knob to light and pressing the Ignitor button or the right. You will hear a "whoosh" sound when it lights.
- 4. Once you have finished grilling turn the two knobs to the off position. You do not need to turn off the timer - it will go off on its own.
- 5. Clean the grill and close the cover.
